Ragnar Elmgren is professor emeritus of Brackish Water Ecology at the Department of Ecology, Environment and Plant Sciences at Stockholm University and a long-term colleague of Fredrik Wulff. Elmgren received his Ph.D. from Stockholm University in 1976 for the thesis "Baltic Benthos Communities and the Role of the Meiofauna". In 1977-78 he studied the ecological effects of marine oil pollution at the Graduate School of Oceanography, University of Rhode Island. After returning to Stockholm University he studied Baltic Sea ecosystems, with an emphasis on bottom fauna, ecosystem effects of eutrophication, cyanobacterial blooms, and, increasingly, management issues. He has supervised 20 Marine Ecology PhDs. His current research projects deal with adaptive management of nutrient discharges to the coastal zone, and Baltic Sea cyanobacterial blooms.
